The Toronto Food Film Fest announces full lineup including highly anticipated food program

TORONTO – With one month till the event, the **Toronto Food Film Fest** is proud to announce its full lineup of events and screenings for its first ever October 4th and 5th festival.

The upcoming, annual 2-day festival will include 21 films, 5 features and 16 shorts, and 12 events bringing new and unique food experiences to Toronto.

At each film screening patrons can purchase delicious paired snacks curated by **Chez Dine** and featuring a rotation of dishes from esteemed chefs including **Chef Jackie Lin** of **Shoushin, Chef Ramon Simarro** of **Madrina Bar y Tapas** and **Chef Dustin Gallagher** of **416 Snack Bar**.

The Toronto Food Film Fest is proud to showcase its food events including a Handmade Pasta Workshop & Supper Club led by Chef Nicole Di Nardo, the Rooted in North American Harvest Supper Club with Chef Taylor Parker and a Lunch & Learn Workshop with Chef Daniel Holloway, all happening at The Depanneur, where these chefs will share their stories of food beyond the plate.

The events also include a highly anticipated intimate interview with recent Order of Canada Appointee **Nick Saul** of **Community Food Centres Canada**. He will be in conversation with TV host and foodie **Pay Chen** at the **Super Wonder Gallery**.

The festival will also highlight talented Canadian filmmakers like Abby Ainsworth and Lindsey Kunter with their film **STAGE: The Culinary Internship** screening as the Saturday, Oct 5th closing featured presentation and Toronto Premiere. Ainsworth will also be featured along with directors JR Reid, Lynn Hamrick and more in the **Directing for Documentary Round Table** Friday, Oct 4th.



Feature films also include the James Beard nominated, **Funke**, internationally acclaimed **Hiro's Table**, the Canadian drama **Nose to Tail** and the Friday Oct 4th feature presentation and North American Premiere of Spanish film, **A God in Each Lentil**.

In support of independent filmmaking, **Rolling Pictures** and **Sim International** have each announced they will be giving a \$5,000 certificate award. **Grande Camera** (formerly Dazmo) has also announced that they will be allotting a \$1,000 certificate award to one lucky film. Prizes will be announced on Saturday Oct 5th during the **Closing Awards Party** at the **Super Wonder Gallery**. The festival aims to promote the local neighbourhood by holding events at venues in walking distance within Little Italy.

The festival aims to become the lowest waste film festival by committing to diverting waste from the landfill by using compostable food service containers and managing waste with partner **Rethink Resource**. Surplus food will be collected and donated.

In its first year, the festival has already garnered a huge amount of international interest with submissions from 21 countries globally - emphasizing the demand for a food-themed film festival in Canada's largest, and most multicultural city. The festival will run for two days at the **Royal Cinema** on College Street, in the heart of downtown Toronto.
